## AMENDMENT TO FORSYTH COUNTY GEORGIA ORDINANCE NUMBER 101

An Ordinance of Forsyth County, Georgia to adopt the Rules and Regulations Regarding Turn Lanes, Driveway and Encroachment Control

WHEREAS, the Constitution of the State of Georgia, approved by the voters, of the State in November of 1982, and effective July 1, 1983, provides in Article IX, Section II, Paragraph I that the governing authority of the county may adopt clearly reasonable ordinances, resolutions and regulations; and

WHEREAS, O.C.G.A. § 36-1-20 authorizes counties to enact ordinances for protecting and preserving the public health, safety and welfare of the population of the unincorporated areas of the County; and

WHEREAS, the governing authority of Forsyth County, to wit, the Board of Commissioners, is desirous of executing its authority in adopting this ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Chapters 14-4.5 and 18-5.8 of the Forsyth County Unified Development Code, among others, authorize the Forsyth County Department of Engineering to establish standards and criteria for curbs, gutters, entrances, exits, acceleration and deceleration lanes, and left and right turn lanes; and

WHEREAS, in accord with that authority, and with the authority otherwise possessed by the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners, the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners deems it advisable to adopt the State of Georgia Department of Transportation ("DOT") regulations for Driveway and Encroachment control; and

WHEREAS, the Regulations for Driveway and Encroachment Control promulgated by the Georgia Department of Transportation make reasonable and sound provision for the spacing and design of driveways, curb cuts, turn lanes, and acceleration/deceleration lanes in the County;

**NOW THEREFORE,** be it resolved and ordained by the Board of Commissioners of Forsyth County, Georgia, and it is hereby resolved and ordained by the authority of same, that the State DOT Regulations for Driveway and Encroachment Control, promulgated March 2, 2004 (attached hereto as Exhibit "A") are declared the pertinent design and development regulations for purposes of constructing roadway curbs, gutters, entrances, exits, acceleration and deceleration lanes, and left and right turn lanes, in Forsyth County, as authorized and otherwise required by the Forsyth County Unified

Development Code and the Forsyth County Department of Engineering;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that within the State DOT Regulations for Driveway and Encroachment Control, for purposes of enforcement in Forsyth County, all references to "Department" or "DOT" shall mean the Forsyth County Department of Engineering. All references to the "District Access Management Engineer" shall refer to the "County Engineer," and all references to the "District Engineer" shall refer to the "Forsyth County Director of Engineering." Moreover, to the extent the DOT Regulations for Driveway and Encroachment Control rely upon the Average Daily Traffic ("ADT"), said number will be projected out 20 years.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that in addition to State DOT Regulations for Driveway and Encroachment Control, the Forsyth County Department of Engineering shall be guided by the following principles and policy objectives in in the design and construction of roadway curbs, gutters, entrances, exits, acceleration and deceleration lanes, and left and right turn lanes:

- 1. At intersections where there are no stop signs, yield signs or other traffic signals, if two vehicles come to the intersection at the same time, the driver of the vehicle on the left must yield to the driver of the vehicle on the right;
- 2. When making a left turn at an intersection, or into an alley or driveway, yield the right of way to all traffic coming from the opposite direction;
- 3. Yield the right of way to all vehicles, including bicycles, which are approaching from the opposite direction, and pedestrians crossing either roadway;
- 4. Vehicle drivers should understand right of way rules to avoid conflicts and to determine adequate gap to safely cross the pathway of approaching vehicles. Poorly executed left turns result in t-bone crashes and consequently are very dangerous maneuvers.
